**Get Counseled** Seek accountability and advice for the journey. Find a mentor.

When you are asking yourself, "How do I go about getting personally involved in cross-cultural ministry?" it is so important to have someone to talk to. Does your pastor know of this vision growing in your heart? Write him a letter or meet with him. It may also be helpful to pursue a mentoring relationship with someone who is knowledgeable of the opportunities out there. Ask him or her to keep you accountable to the commitment you have made to the Lord. This mentor could help you make out a budget to relieve the danger of debt or help you discern

### Feeling Alone?

Mobilize your local church to stand with you.

In some cases a home church may not react encouragingly to a student's new vision. If this



nappens to you, don't give up. Set out to mobilize that church so they will be eager to join God in what he is doing. Pray, share ideas with the mission

committee, supply the church with eye-opening resources, inform them of conferences and possible speakers, offer to organize a mission trip or to coordinate a *Perspectives* course. Use this time to serve your church in any way; it is vital training for ministry.

>> Inspire your congregation with compelling stories of what God is doing in the world through the hands of ordinary Christians! Shaping Eternity is a five-part video series created

to help your church witness the transformation people undergo by finding a new sense of purpose while participating in the mission of spreading God's fame to the unreached. ### PITFALLS

Lifestyle choices How are your lifestyle choices being determined - by the Lord

or by society? We live in a society that tells us we have to have an SUV and a cell phone just because. Don't follow blindly into this black hole. Evaluate what your real needs

are as opposed to unnecessary conveniences. Don't compare yourself with Americans who make up the top of the world's wealthy. Consider how other societies live. Spend money on what would benefit your ministry and please the Lord rather than getting carried away in the current of the "American Dream."

"Help, I've fallen and can't get up." Credit card debt and school debt delay many from active involvement in missions. In the interim many lose interest and settle into the normal American lifestyle.

Don't lose your focus. Live on a tight budget and use every extra penny to pay it off. Pray God would raise up the means to cancel it

### Straggler's Shelter "I'm too busy to do God's will"

It is hard to admit this about ourselves, but is it true? Are you so busy that you turn down opportunities to serve or to learn more about God's heart before asking him if he wants you to say "yes?" Have you considered freeing up your schedule so you are available?

It is so easy to get carried away with activities. Sit down and write out a mission statement for your life. What are your priorities, your goals, a Scripture you would like to live by? From then on evaluate which activities apply to that mission statement and avoid those which distract from it. This will help you keep your priorities in order.

### **Get Training**

Pursue cross-cultural and Bible training. It's essential

So many missionaries, once they get overseas and encounter the challenges of cross-cultural church planting, wish they had invested more into training. It is the kind of thing where you don't realize how much there is to know until you start learning. Consider cross-cultural communications, anthropology, linguistics, and Bible courses.



But these days getting that training can be done in a variety of ways: Bible Colleges, Liberal Arts Christian Colleges, Internet courses, 1-2 year

Another way to meet internationals is to host international students. An estimated 40% of the world's heads of state were college students in the US. Nearly 60% of international students come from the 10/40 Window, and 25% come from countries where no missionary activity is allowed. While in the US these students are free from the spiritual strongholds of their home countries and are more receptive to the gospel. The need for welcomers is great. Unfortunately 70% of international students never see the inside of an American home and even fewer ever visit a Christian church. 


